Registration Information:

- Class size is limited to 12 students max. with 1 teacher. Minimum 6.
- All classes will take place in our Cottage — located at 503 Main St. Richmond. Drop off will be at the 5th street entrance to the Cottage.
- Registration begins immediately and will remain open until the Wednesday before the scheduled camp, unless it is filled. If a class is canceled, fees will be refunded.
- Register by mail or in person at Shady Oak. Your check serves as confirmation of your child's enrollment in our program. You may call the office to confirm receipt of your registration form and payment (281-341-5001) and will also receive an email from our office confirming your child's place.
- Classes meet Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
- You will provide a morning snack, water bottle and lunch for your child.

Her mother is busy working for the Red Cross. We will hear their stories and participate in discussions about major historical events and their effects on the details of everyday life. All events are seen through the eyes of 9-10 year old girls. Emphasis will be put on positive traits and values portrayed in the characters that we want to develop in the girls of today. We will enjoy crafts, art, games, and cooking from these periods of history. The week will culminate with an optional parent/child event on Friday.

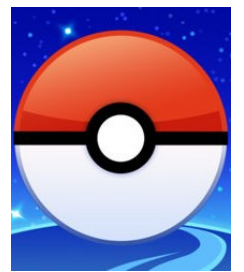
